

GUIDELINES FOR BOOK REVIEWS

We are happy to announce that the *Journal of Military Aviation History* staff is now accepting book review submissions for our first volume.

- Go to the list of books available for review on the *JMAH* website and choose one. Email a formal request to write that book's review to the editor, including a copy of your vitae to vwilliams@acu.edu.
- Reviews should be presented for books which pertain to military aviation history, and ought to be between 750 and 1,200 words, or 2 to 3 pages, in length.
- Reviews are be emailed to vwilliams@acu.edu. They should be written, using the Chicago Manual of Style format, and saved as a Word document (doc or docx file format).
- The review should contain an overview of the scope, purpose, and content of the volume together with an analysis of the author's success or failure to achieve his or her stated objectives.
- The author will avoid personal or intemperate remarks or comments and confine the assessment to a fair treatment of the author and the book produced. If these terms are violated, the review will absolutely not be published, but we will contact the author to attempt to remedy the situation. We suggest having at least one third party read over your review before submitting it if you are concerned that you may be breaching these terms.
- Avoid discussion of typographical errors or other minor flaws unless they contribute in a substantial way to the value of the book.
- At the close of your review your name and affiliation should be placed opposite one another, double spaced from the article, right and left justified, respectively.

- Each review needs to have the *JMAH* book review heading at the top of the first page. The special heading should include the following: Book author last name, first name. Book title in italics. City published: publisher, year published. Number of pages. Price: \$xx.xx.

Example:

Howlitt, Joel Ira. *"Execute Against Japan": The U.S. Decision to Conduct Unrestricted Submarine Warfare*. College Station: Texas A&M University Press, 2009. Pp. 262. Price \$37.50.
